Navigating to known coordinates

Each of the locations listed below is marked with flagging tape. Written on the flagging tape is the number and name associated with the location.

When you locate the flagging tape, check the number, and write down the name, to verify that you were there.

Example Flagging Tape: 0000 Sparrow

The location 2001 has not been saved into your GPS. You will need to enter it as a new waypoint. On the class eTrex GPS receivers, the other locations have been preloaded.

Use the GOTO feature of the GPS to navigate to each of the locations.

Hints:

- Plot these locations on the Google Satellite Photo before you try to locate them.
- The list order is not necessarily the best order to visit the locations, use your map.
- In many cases your mark on the map will be more useful for navigating than the GPS receiver. Use both methods.
- Double check to make sure your GPS is set to UTM, NAD27 CONUS
